Cost per household to provide these services was \$115.05. These services were not offered to businesses. Waste Management of the Piedmont provides solid waste and recycling services via contract. The Town provides yard waste pickup, which is carried to West Wall Street for mulching and composting.

Recycling is very important and essential to our environment. Please note the following items have been banned from all State landfills:

- Motor oil and oil filters
- Computers
- Compact Fluorescent Light Bulbs (CFLs)
- Tires
- Pallets

NOTE: Motor oil & oil filters can be recycled at Rural Hall Automotive. Computers & bulbs can be recycled at the 3RC on Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd in Winston-Salem. Wooden pallets can be recycled at A&J Pallet in Rural Hall.

Leaf Pickup

The Town will begin leaf pickup in mid-October and the service will continue through mid-January. The Public Works' crew picks up leaves each week on Mondays. During peak times, it may take them several days to run a complete cycle so they will begin picking up on Mondays and continue through the week as needed. Every effort is made to pick up leaves at least once a week.

Remember:

- Rake early and frequently
- Do **NOT** put leaves in bags
- Rake leaves to the edge of the road, not in the street or on the sidewalk
- Do<u>NOT</u> mix limbs, trash or other debris with leaves.
- Do <u>**NOT**</u> park in front of or near the leaf pile.
- Do <u>NOT</u> allow children or animals to play in the leaf pile.

There is no need to call Town Hall for pickup.

Brush & Limbs

- Brush and limbs are picked up each Tuesday
- Contractor work <u>will not</u> be picked up
- Limbs should be no longer than 6 feet or wider than 6 inches in diameter
- Property owners with more than one load a week will be charged \$100.00 for each additional load
- Residents are requested to call Town Hall to schedule service by 4 PM on Mondays
- Brush and limbs should be at the road by 7AM on Tuesdays for service

Bulk Items

- Bulk items are picked up each Tuesday
- Items should be at the road by 7AM on Tuesdays for service
- Lead base paint, tires, glass and other hazardous items will not be accepted by the Town
- Residents are requested to call Town Hall for service by 4 PM on Mondays

Stormwater

Yard clippings and leaves can wash into storm drains and contribute nutrients and organic matter to streams. Grass clippings, leaves, and yard trimmings that are recycled or composted are a free source of nutrients for your yard, supplying not only carbon and nitrogen, but they also shade the soil and reduce the need for water. Water pollution problems from yard waste can be diminished by following these guidelines:

- Never rake or blow leaves, grass clippings and other debris into the street or storm drains
- 2. Compost or mulch yard waste
- 3. Cover piles of dirt or mulch being used in landscaping projects
