



# Reminder of Town Ordinance for Junked or Abandoned Motor Vehicles

Ordinance #82 for the Town of Rural Hall, Disposition of Junked or Abandoned Vehicles, defines abandoned and junk vehicles as the following:

## A vehicle shall be deemed to have been <u>abandoned</u> in any of the following circumstances:

- It has been left upon a street or highway within the Town of Rural Hall in violation of a law or ordinance prohibiting parking for a period of longer than twenty-four (24) hours
- It is incapable of self-propulsion or being moved in the manner for which it was originally intended
- It is left on property owned or operated by the Town of Rural Hall for a period of not less than twenty-four (24) hours
- It is left on private property without the consent of the owner, occupant or lessee thereof for a period of not less than twentyfour (24) hours
- It is left on any public street or highway within the Town for a period of not less than seven (7) days

Junk vehicle: Whenever a vehicle is found to be abandoned, as defined above, and in addition, is found to be inoperable, partially dismantled or damaged, cannot be self-propelled in the manner it was originally intended to move, or five (5) years old or older, and worth less than five hundred dollars (\$500), or does not display a current license plate, it shall be deemed to be an abandoned motor vehicle that is also a junk motor vehicle.

#### Ordinance #82 also addresses:

- Vehicles abandoned on private property and public grounds
- Abandoned vehicles not enhancing community or neighborhood appearance

- The removal, sale, towing and storage of abandoned vehicles
- Permitted concealment or enclosure of a junked vehicle. One junked vehicle is permitted if it is entirely concealed by an approved car cover and does not constitute any safety/ health hazard.

Violation of the provisions of this ordinance can subject the offender to towing and storage/impoundment charges. All charges incurred by the Town of Rural Hall or imposed upon the owner in connection with an impounded vehicle shall constitute a lien upon such vehicle, and the impounded vehicle shall not be released until all charges are paid.
